ANEMONES

The anemone is a member of the Ranunculaceae family, a large family of polypetalous plants that includes the buttercup, peony, and larkspur. Some of the 150 species of anemones are also known as windflowers, from the Greek *anemos* for wind, which aptly describes a flower whose long stem sways with the breeze. In Greek mythology, when Adonis, loved by Aphrodite for his beauty, was killed by a wild boar he had wounded, the broken-hearted goddess of love knelt over his body and wept. On the ground where Aphrodite's tears fell sprang anemones.
